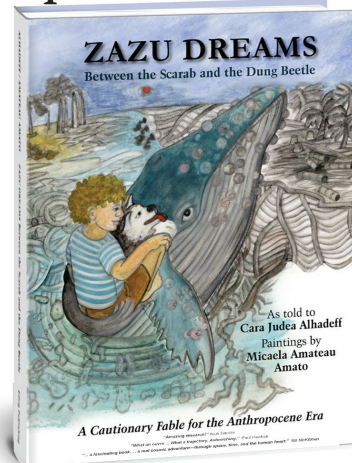


ZAZU DREAMS:
